



Position Description: Program Instructor

The **Wilmington Children's Chorus** is the only tuition-free, community children's chorus in the nation. Our mission is to **empower young people to change their world through music** and our programs are guided by our values of Access, Excellence, and Diversity & Inclusion. Known throughout the region for their artistry and educational standards, WCC involves over 650 singers, ages 6wks-18yrs, in Performing Choirs, Neighborhood Choirs, the Early Learner's Music Program, and many summer programs.

Job Description: WCC is seeking an enthusiastic and kind teacher who is dedicated to improving children's lives. The Program Instructor's primary responsibilities will be:

- Teaching the Early Learner's Programs (music, movement, and play-based instruction, ages 6wks-5yrs)
- Leading three Neighborhood Choirs (after-school choirs at community partner sites, ages 5-12)
- Developing a new Preparatory Division for WCC's Performing Choirs (ages 4-5 and 6-7) & assisting in Youth Choir rehearsals (ages 8-13)
- Serving as an instructor for summer camps (ages 5-13)

Minimum required qualification (*at least one of the following*):

- Undergraduate degree in music education
- AND/OR 2+ years of teaching experience in early childhood and/or elementary music

The **ideal applicant** would have a high level of training and practical experience in the following areas:

- Vocal-based music education instruction of children ages 6wks-12yrs (ages vary by program) *
 - Creation of goals and instructional objectives, lesson planning, repertoire selection, etc.
- Culturally responsive teaching and social-emotional learning
- Strong vocal skills; playing keyboard and/or guitar is a plus
- Exceptional classroom management and organization skills
- Thinking creatively and working both independently and collaboratively
- Professional communication skills to effectively coordinate with WCC staff, families, and partners
- Spanish language skills are a plus

* WCC recognizes that early childhood music is a specialized skill. If an applicant is highly qualified in all other areas, WCC will offer training/certification in GIML Early Childhood Music Learning Theory.

Position Type: Full Time/Exempt

Salary range: \$42,000-\$52,000

Benefits: Medical, vision, dental, and 401(k); Unlimited paid time off; supportive environment with mentorship and generous planning periods incorporated into each instructional day.

Duties:

Early Learner's Music (ELM) Program

- Create and implement lesson plans for children ages 6 weeks – 5 years old
- Create site goals and instructional objectives
- Work collaboratively with classroom teachers to plan lessons that align with classroom objectives, themes, and site culture
- Assist Program Coordinator with parent/family communication
- Assist Program Coordinator with planning and implementing special events for each ELM site
- Track participant progress for program evaluation
- Create family outreach materials and send to Program Coordinator for distribution

Neighborhood Choirs

- Create and implement lesson plans for children ages 5-12
 - Lesson plans should include the study of choral repertoire, musicianship that is focused on ear training, and culture/history/language study
- Create site goals and instructional objectives
- Work with Artistic Director to select developmentally appropriate choral repertoire for concerts
- Work with afterschool coordinators to schedule classes, coordinate events, plan for cultural holidays, and incorporate Neighborhood Choirs into community center/school concerts and events
- Track participant progress for program evaluation
- Assist Program Coordinator with parent/family communication
- Assist Program Coordinator with planning and implementing special events for each Neighborhood Choir site.
- Create family outreach materials and send to Program Coordinator for distribution
- Assist WCC staff with advertising summer camp and Performing Choir opportunities, to ensure program crossover
- Conduct Neighborhood Choir site concerts (typically occur in December and May) and lead combined Neighborhood Choirs at main-stage concerts (December and May)

Summer Camps

- Create and implement lesson plans for children ages 5-13
 - Lesson plans should include the study of choral repertoire, musicianship that is focused on ear training, and culture/history/language study
- Create site goals and instructional objectives
- Create family outreach materials and send to Program Coordinator for distribution
- Work with Artistic Director to select developmentally appropriate choral repertoire
- Work with other artists (example: percussion instructor) to incorporate instrumental exploration into camp weeks
- Work with community center staff and Program Coordinator to organize culminative camp concert
- Conduct cumulative camp concerts
- Assist WCC staff with advertising Performing Choir opportunities, to ensure Program Crossover

Performing Choirs

- Youth Choirs
 - Participate in auditions for Youth Choir (take place in September and January)

- Assist in Youth Choir rehearsals (Tuesday evenings)
- Preparatory Division
 - Work with Artistic Director to develop curriculum and goals for new Preparatory Division (ages 4-5 & 6-7)
 - Serve as the sole instructor of the Preparatory Division
 - Assist Program Coordinator with planning and implementing special events
 - Lead Prep Division in relevant performance opportunities and at special events
 - Regularly communicate with parents/families on children’s progress
 - Track participant progress for program evaluation
 - Create family outreach materials and send to Program Coordinator for distribution
 - Assist WCC staff in advertising Preparatory Division opportunity to broader community

Administrative or otherwise

- Serve as passionate advocate for the transformational power of music in children’s lives
- Champion the work of WCC in the broader Wilmington/New Castle County community
- Provide staff assistance during WCC concerts and events
- Meet regularly with the Artistic/Teaching team of WCC to discuss progress, goals, and objectives
- Meet regularly with WCC staff to provide updates on program progress
- Stay up to date on research and updates in childhood development (including early childhood), music education, Music Learning Theory, and choral music
- Represent WCC at conferences and events for music educators
- Other duties as assigned
